



## Portugal- D2 Visa – The Entrepreneur & Nomad Pathway to Europe

The Portugal D2 Visa, also called the **Entrepreneur Visa**, is one of Europe's most flexible residency pathways for entrepreneurs, freelancers, startup founders, consultants, and independent professionals who want to live and work legally in Portugal while building a business or remote career.

Unlike passive investment programs, the D2 Visa focuses on **active economic contribution** — meaning you are expected to run, develop, or manage a business or independent activity in Portugal.

## Why the Portugal D2 Visa Is Ideal for Investors & Digital Nomads

### 1. No Fixed Minimum Investment

One of the biggest advantages of the D2 Visa is that Portugal does **not require a fixed investment amount** like many residency-by-investment programs.

Instead, authorities evaluate:

- Your business idea
- Financial sustainability
- Economic impact
- Ability to support yourself in Portugal

This makes the D2 Visa more accessible for:

The D2 Visa is available for **non-EU / non-EEA / non-Swiss nationals**.

Eligible applicants include:

## **Investors in Active Businesses**

Applicants investing in or acquiring an existing Portuguese company and participating in operations or management.

Applicants usually need:

- Service contracts
- Client agreements
- Portfolio
- Proof of professional activity

## **Digital Nomads with Business Activity**

Remote professionals operating:

- Online businesses
- International consulting firms
- Remote agencies
- E-commerce stores

The D2 is often considered a strong alternative to the D8 Digital Nomad Visa because it provides broader entrepreneurial flexibility.

## **Main Eligibility Requirements**

### **1. Business Plan**

A detailed business plan is the most important part of the application.

It should explain:

- Business model
- Services/products
- Financial projections
- Revenue expectations
- Market opportunity
- Why Portugal benefits from your business

Authorities want to see:

- Sustainability
- Viability
- Economic contribution

### **2. Financial Means**

Applicants must demonstrate sufficient funds for:

- Personal living expenses
- Business operations

Common practical benchmark:

- Around €25,000+ annual personal funds for main applicant is highly recommended
- Additional funds for dependents

### **3. Portuguese Bank Account, NIF & NISS**

Before applying, applicants usually need:

- Portuguese tax number (NIF)
- Portuguese social number (NISS)
- Portuguese bank account

These are used to show:

- Financial preparedness
- Initial business capital
- Accommodation payments



#### **4. Accommodation in Portugal**

Applicants must provide:

- Rental agreement
- Property ownership proof
- Long-term accommodation evidence

#### **5. Clean Criminal Record**

Police clearance certificates are required from:

- Country of residence
- Countries where applicant lived recently

#### **6. Health Insurance**

Valid travel or international health insurance is required during the visa stage.

### **Step-by-Step D2 Visa Process**

#### **Step 1 – Prepare Business Structure**

Choose your pathway:

- Freelancer
- Sole trader
- New company
- Existing company investment or Franchise investment

#### **Step 2 – Obtain Portuguese NIF**

The NIF (tax number) is essential for:

- Banking
- Contracts
- Company formation
- Rental agreements



### **Step 3 – Open Portuguese Bank Account**

Deposit sufficient funds to demonstrate financial capacity.

### **Step 4 – Create Business Plan**

Prepare a professional business proposal showing:

- Economic value
- Revenue strategy
- Portuguese market relevance

### **Step 5 – Secure Accommodation**

Rent or purchase property in Portugal.

### **Step 6 – Submit- D2 Visa Application**

Application is submitted through:

- Portuguese Consulate
- VFS center in your home country

### **Step 7 – Receive Entry Visa**

Usually valid for entry into Portugal.

### **Step 8 – Attend AIMA Appointment in Portugal**

After arrival, applicants attend residence permit appointment with AIMA (Portuguese immigration authority).

## **Processing Time**

<b>Stage</b>	<b>Estimated Time</b>
Document Preparation	1–2 months
Consulate Processing	1–3 months
Portugal Residence Appointment	Several weeks to months
Total Average Timeline	3–6 months

Processing times vary by country and consulate workload.
